PASTOR'S MESSAGE

Walking Together: Divine Service as the Source of Strength and Peace

Recently, I read an article on the British author J.R.R. Tolkien and fatherhood. Tolkien was the author of epic works of modern fiction, including *The Hobbit*, *The Lord of the Rings*, and *The Silmarillion*. In addition to being a decorated officer in the British Army, a distinguished professor at Oxford University, and a best-selling author, Tolkien was a devoted father and a devout Christian.

As a father, Tolkien made time to eat each meal of the day with his children, to listen to them talk about their day, to go on a walk with them, and to read to them. As a father myself I could not understand how he fit it all in. How could Tolkien be such a good father, spend so much time with his kids, and still serve his university, tutor students, and write some of the greatest fiction of the twentieth century?

When asked the same question by a reporter, Tolkien gave a response that must have been astonishing. Tolkien cited the source of his strength as regular attendance at worship, hearing the Word of God, and regularly receiving the Sacrament of Christ's body and blood. Later in life, after losing his wife, Tolkien would say that the words of the liturgy got him through his time of grieving as a widower.

Tolkien was right, the Divine Service strengthens us. It gives us true peace, peace that the world does not give. An outsider to the Christian faith will never be able to understand this kind of devotion and peace, not unless they too are brought by the Holy Spirit into the Christian Church. The reason why the Divine Service gives us peace and strength is because Jesus Christ shows up for us there.


In the Divine Service, Jesus Christ, true God and true human, shows up for us. The same Jesus who became a human for us through the womb of the Virgin Mary, who died for us, and who rose again for us comes to us in the Divine Service. Jesus comes to us in the Absolution, forgiving our sins. Jesus comes to us through the words of the liturgy, which calm us down and drown out all of the blathering of harsh voices from the world. Jesus comes with His body and blood in the bread and wine of Holy Communion, strengthening our faith, reminding us that we are at peace with God, and that Jesus has overcome even death for us. This is why attendance at Divine Service is so important: because this is where Jesus shows up for you.

As we enter the first year of our outreach roadmap, *Walking Together*, we are focusing intentionally on our educational offerings and on worship life. To this end, we purposefully seek to conduct the Divine Service and all of our common devotional life from the perspective of pastoral care. We seek to hear and understand more deeply why we worship the Triune God in the way that we do and how that awakens and nourishes our faith in Christ.

Over the next few months, in *Jottings* and *Faith Bites*, I will explore together with you how our liturgical worship is formed by God's promise in the Gospel of Christ and how Christ comes to us with His good gifts through the Divine Service. As part of this exploration, we will look together at our new hymnal, the *Lutheran Service Book*, and see how it preserves, continues, builds upon, and furthers our historic Lutheran liturgy and hymnody. This focus in *Jottings* and *Faith Bites* will be coupled with explaining and walking through some aspects of the liturgy during the Divine Service. We will even have some children's sermons where I encourage the kids in discovery of the liturgy's formative role in our Christian life.

The most important thing to know about liturgy and the Divine Service is to know that you are invited. It's for you! It is for you that Christ Jesus died and rose. It is for you that He shows up in the Divine Service. It is for you that He offers there His gifts of forgiveness, eternal life, and peace that the world cannot give. Tolkien was right; the Divine Service is our source of lasting peace and strength.

HOLY BAPTISM — OCTOBER 1-15

Water and Word wash us into Christ's death and resurrection. "Baptism ... now saves you, not as a removal of dirt from the body but as an appeal to God for a good conscience, through the resurrection of Jesus Christ" (1 Peter 3:21). We daily remember our Baptism through repentance and forgiveness in the cross of Christ. Through our Baptism, we are brought into the Church, the Body of Christ. As we pray, we rejoice in God's gift of Baptism and continue to rejoice in the gifts of forgiveness, the Holy Spirit and eternal life granted to us in Word and Sacrament.

Remember God's gift of Baptism as you pray:

- 1.** Thank God for His gifts of Word and Sacrament, that through these means God freely gives His grace to sinners by faith.
- 2.** Thank God for the gift of Baptism, that His Word works through the water to join us to Christ's death and resurrection.
- 3.** Thank God for the gift of Baptism, that His Word combines with the water to deliver forgiveness and eternal life.
- 4.** Rejoice that the Holy Spirit gives faith and sustains us in the faith.
- 5.** Thank God for the gift of Baptism for adults, that those who are instructed in the faith and who were not baptized as children may receive the gift of forgiveness and life in the waters of Baptism.
- 6.** for parents, that they might faithfully raise their children in the fear and admonition of the Lord, teaching them His Word and bringing them to the Sacrament.
- 7.** for sponsors, that they might faithfully work with parents to teach the faith to the baptized.
- 8.** for all the baptized, that in daily repentance all might cling to God's promises of forgiveness and eternal life in Christ.
- 9.** for all the baptized, that they might daily cling to their Baptism and hope in Christ alone.
- 10.** for all the baptized, that the Spirit would keep the Church strong in persecution.
- 11.** for all the baptized, that they witness to all about the death and resurrection of Jesus.
- 12.** for all who are not baptized, that the Spirit would draw them to Christ in faith.
- 13.** Thank God for the Baptism of Jesus, that He took on our sins to suffer in our stead.



- 15.** That Christ would return quickly, that the Church might dwell with Him in righteousness, holiness and blessedness.


OCTOBER *Pray For Us Calendar*

THE LORD'S SUPPER — OCTOBER 16-31

Bread and wine, body and blood feed us with the food that endures to eternal life. Christ gives His body and blood to His body the Church. Those who have faith in the words, “given and shed for you” receive what those words promise, the forgiveness of sins.

Remember God's gift of the Sacrament of the Altar as you pray:

- 16.** Thank God for the Sacrament of the Altar, that it is the true body and blood of our Lord Jesus Christ under the bread and wine.
- 17.** Rejoice that in the Sacrament forgiveness of sins, life and salvation are given.
- 18.** That God would grant us faith in His Word, that we worthily receive the Sacrament and live in repentance.
- 19.** Thank God for daily bread, even the bread of life that we receive in the Sacrament.
- 20.** For preparation before receiving the Sacrament, that all might receive it trusting in the Words of Christ.
- 21.** Thank God for the Church and the Office of the Holy Ministry.
- 22.** For the unity of the Church, that schisms might cease, and all might be united in the true faith.
- 23.** that we, who are many, may see ourselves as the one Body of Christ.
- 24.** for the Church, that she remains faithful to the truth of God's Word.
- 25.** for the LCMS, that we might believe, teach and confess all things according to God's will.
- 26.** with thanksgiving that God continues to strengthen us through His Word and Sacraments.
- 27.** for those who do not belong to the Church, that God would call all to faith.
- 28.** for the sustenance of the Sacrament of the Altar, that God would grant faith unto eternal life.

EARTH CARE

“THE EARTH IS THE LORD’S ...” PSALM 24:1

This column intends to highlight ways to care for God’s creation.
Maynard and Shirley Dorow pursue Earth care issues and welcome your feedback.



God has “made me together with all creatures...” says Martin Luther’s Small Catechism.

From this and all the Biblical insights supporting it comes the LCMS April 2020 report called “*together with all creatures – Caring for God’s Living Earth,*” and this column notes one part of the report that helps us think about the deep truths of being made together with all creatures.

ALL creatures? It doesn’t take long to be in awe of that statement when you consider, e.g. that there are likely some 100 billion birds (*Birdpedia*, p.4) and further consider that just one ant colony can consist of 20 million ants. Entomologists and ecologists argue that we literally can’t live without ants. They outnumber humans by 1.5 million to one, and the biomass of all the ants on earth is roughly equal to the biomass of all the people on the planet. These ants aerate soil, improve draining and soil chemistry, disperse seeds and prey on pests. If ants disappeared, entire ecosystems would collapse. (“What good are ants?” AntBlog. Chicago Field Museum) These are two of the smaller creatures among the “ALL” that God created along with us human creatures. Psalm 104:27 notes that both humans and all other creatures seek their food from God; all possess the breath of life and are regarded as “living creatures.” Thus both suffer the effects of the fall.

These two small examples of the enormous inter-dependency of creation give pause for examining our care of all these creatures. The farmer who stops his plow to move the bird’s nest to a safer place is aware; the gardener who leaves part of the lettuce growing outside his fenced-in garden for the rabbits; the fisherman who does not overfish and waste “the little ones;” the parents who model respect for the animals of the wild -- these all are thinking beyond human dominion and working to restore creation to God’s respectful balance.

The “*together with all creatures*” report puts it this way:

We best care for God’s earth when we embrace our creatureliness by showing dignity and responsibility for all creatures and seeking their well-being by caring for the earth upon which their well-being depends.

And, we best care for God’s earth when we delight in our creaturely connections. Yes, let’s take that walk in the woods, sit on the deck and watch the birds, follow that ant trail in the back yard and marvel at God’s creatures.
