PASTOR'S MESSAGE

Walking Together:
Gone and With Us

There are people who I wished that I had gotten to know more before they died. Three in particular come to mind. One is a retired pastor in my vicarage congregation who passed away during my first weeks on the job. I visited with him during his last days, and I quickly realized that I would have liked to know him longer and absorb more of the wisdom he accumulated during his years of ministry.

Another is a pastor who also was a professor at one of our seminaries. I met him at our Synodical convention in 2019. His passion for preaching the Gospel and reaching the lost was contagious. Although he was highly respected and even famous within the Lutheran world, he took time during a busy week to talk with someone just starting out in the pastoral ministry like me.

Finally, there is a pastor who suddenly passed away in the last month who I met only once. He successfully led an urban congregation in outreaching in a neighborhood much like the St. Paul Midway. He leaves behind a legacy of decades of urban ministry in the LCMS.

These are only three. There are many more fellow Christians who I wish I had known better. I'm sure there are people in your lives too that you wish you had known better. I'm sure there also are people in your lives whom you knew very well, with whom you maybe wanted just one more conversation. But now they are gone.

The Good News is that as believers in the crucified and risen Christ, they are only gone temporarily. One day Jesus will return visibly to earth and awaken them from the sleep of death. He will awaken them to live and never die again. Until that time, they are safe within His care.

At the same time, there also is a sense in which those who have died in faith are present with us when we come to the Lord's Supper. The Sacrament of Holy Communion is a communal meal. It is a feast in which our Lord serves us His own body and blood for our salvation, forgiveness, and eternal life. In this Sacrament, our crucified, risen, and ascended Lord Jesus is really present with us. He shows up for us.

When He does show up, He carries with Him all who have fallen asleep trusting in His promise of eternal life. We cannot see them or hear them, but where our Lord Jesus is, there also are all His saints. When Christ is bodily present, the entire body of Christ is present.

Many of you have told me that you feel close to a departed loved one when you come to Holy Communion. It's not just a feeling. It's the truth. We are together with them in Him, despite death. For our Lord Jesus has conquered death.

One day, we will see them again and be able to spend all of eternity with them. Until that time, we walk together by faith. Yet, even though we do not see them, such faith is not blind faith. It is faith in the One who has defeated death and opened for all of us the path to life everlasting. When we come to our Lord's Sacrament, we get a little taste of that life of eternity that later we will enjoy forever.

and she (Wisdom) calls all people to acknowledge her and her superiority to all creation.



1 Kings 19:9b-21


When Elijah complains about Israel's infidelity,

DOMINICAN REPUBLIC — JUNE 1-30

The Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod (LCMS) officially began work in the Dominican Republic in 2004. Over the years, a group home was established to care for orphaned children with disabilities; congregations and mission plants were started; and a deaconess-training program was launched. The LCMS seminary in Santiago, Dominican Republic, trains students from around the Latin America region.

Remember God's work in the Dominican Republic as you pray:

1. for the seminary students who will enter the seminary this fall, that they would be able to acquire their student visas and other documentation needed to study in the Dominican Republic.
2. for seminary students and their families, that they would have a smooth transition to life in a new place away from family and friends. Praise God for these dedicated students who are willing to leave home to obtain a solid theological education.
3. that God would grant the seminary students determination and endurance, so that they might be diligent in their studies

and make the most of their education.

4. for the women studying to be deaconesses, that the theological coursework and intensive practical experience would form them into capable and effective deaconesses.

5. that God would grant strength to our deaconesses as they support the work of pastors by caring for the poor, the marginalized and the sick.

6. with thanksgiving for all the faithful and generous people who have prayed or given of their time or treasures to make the seminary and mercy center a reality.

7. for the seminary professors, that they would be well-prepared to impart wisdom and knowledge to their students.

8. that the Spanish-language theological library at the seminary would be well used and a blessing to the students and faculty.

9. for the families of the professors, that they would adapt easily and find joy in a new country and culture.

10. for Lutheran congregations in Latin America, that they would be prepared to care for and support their pastors physically, mentally and spiritually.

11. for seminary students who are serving vicarages, that they would learn much from their experience and be better prepared for their future ministry.

12. for all the missionaries and leaders of the Dominican church, that they would discern God's

will so that they can build a firm foundation for the church for generations to come.

13. that God would raise up individuals and congregations to support our LCMS missionaries in the Dominican Republic.

14. that God would supply faithful and capable men and women to serve as missionaries, both in Latin America and around the world.

15. with thanksgiving for faithful men and women who have given up the comforts of home and family to faithfully serve on the mission field.

16. that many in the Dominican Republic would hear God's Word and believe in Jesus Christ as their Lord and Savior. Pray that they would attend worship each Sunday to receive the Word and Sacraments.

17. that God would grant health and safety to all missionaries and their families.

18. that the Dominican Christians would continue to study God's Word and be strengthened to live faithfully and serve their neighbors in love.

19. with thanksgiving for the willingness of the Dominican people to hear and learn God's Word. By God's grace, the LCMIS has established congregations and mission stations around the country.

20. that God would raise up many Lutheran school teachers and school administrators — especially from among the Dominican congregations — to meet the needs of the large number of eager students.

21. that the families of our Lutheran school children would also hear God's Word and be brought to faith.

22. with thanksgiving for the large and ever-growing number of students seeking education in our Lutheran schools in the Dominican Republic.

23. that the Lutheran mission churches in the Dominican

Republic would continue to grow and mature through regular worship and Bible study.

24. with thanksgiving for the many faithful Christians who regularly worship in our mission congregations.

25. with thanksgiving for Hogares Luteranos El Buen Pastor (Good Shepherd Lutheran Home), which provides a safe and nurturing facility for young people with developmental disabilities.

26. that God would grant patience and endurance for the faithful workers who care for the group home's residents. Praise God that He has used these wonderful young people to teach the Dominican Lutheran church about His love and mercy.

27. with thanksgiving that the residents of Hogares Luteranos El Buen Pastor have become active members of the local Lutheran church, where they are eager to hear God's Word and to serve in any way possible.

28. with thanksgiving for the willingness of faithful and gentle caregivers who serve the residents of Good Shepherd Lutheran Home.



29. for all the mission work throughout the Caribbean and Latin America.

30. with thanksgiving that we are one in Christ with our brothers and sisters in Christ in Latin America.




