

Walking Together as Disciples for Life:

Following Jesus to the Cross

When Jesus had finished all these sayings, he said to his disciples, "You know that after two days the Passover is coming, and the Son of Man will be delivered up to be crucified." Matthew 26:1-2 (ESV)

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Throughout the post-Epiphany season, our focus at Jehovah Lutheran has been "Walking Together as Disciples for Life." We have walked together hearing Jesus call his first 12 disciples and preach His Sermon on the Mount. On Sunday, we went with Peter, James, and John to a different mountain, where Jesus was transfigured. With these disciples, we got a glimpse of Jesus as He truly is, as God in the flesh.

In the season of Lent, we continue our walk together as Jesus' disciples. We walk with Jesus through His passion. We walk with Him through His trial, beatings, crucifixion, and resurrection. Finally, we follow Him to the cross, where He dies for our sins.

This year for Lent, we will follow in the footsteps of our Savior, Jesus. During Ash Wednesday and the Sundays of Lent, we'll continue to hear what it means to be disciples of Jesus, but at the same time, we'll be moving closer and closer to the cross. Then, in our midweek Lenten services, we'll walk together with our brothers and sisters from Emmaus, Bethel, and St. Stephanus to the places Jesus went on His path for our salvation. We'll walk together to such places like Bethany, the Mount of Olives, and Bethphage. Then, in Holy Week, our journey with Jesus will take us to the Upper Room and, finally, to Golgotha and the cross.

This Lenten season, I invite you to join us as we walk together with our Savior. I know that as we walk together with our brothers and sisters from other congregations during our midweek services, it will be a little different not being in our own sanctuary for services. But our Lord calls us to walk with Him and with these brothers and sisters. As we engage more fully in cooperative outreach with our sister congregations in the St. Paul area, it will be a little different than it has been before because new people will walk alongside us.

As we worship together with brothers and sisters from Emmaus and Bethel Lutheran Churches, our joint youth group (John 1516s) will be making emergency hygiene kits for families affected by the recent earthquake in Turkey and Syria as well as other natural disasters. A list of items needed for these kits is included in this month's issue of *Jottings* as well as in Sunday bulletins. If you would like to donate items for these kits, you may bring them to the office during this Lenten season.

In the midst of new ventures walking together, Jesus who has always been with us calls us to follow Him, and He promises to go with us every step of the way. Some of our new ventures have already begun; others still await us in the future. Whatever awaits us, we know that our crucified and risen Lord holds the future and all of us in His almighty hands.

For, as we follow Jesus to the cross this Lent, we realize that, as Dietrich Bonhoeffer puts it, we are not so much following Jesus there as that He is bringing us with Him. If Jesus is bringing us with Him to His crucifixion, we know that He also brings us with Him to His resurrection. As St. Paul says, "If we have been united with [Jesus] in a death like His, we shall certainly be united with Him in a resurrection like His." (Romans 6:5).

God bless this season of Lent as you follow our Lord Jesus to the cross where He died for you.


