Walking Together as Disciples for Life:

Job Description

¹⁶ Now the eleven disciples went to Galilee, to the mountain to which Jesus had directed them. ¹⁷ And when they saw him they worshiped him, but some doubted. ¹⁸ And Jesus came and said to them, "All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. ¹⁹ Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, ²⁰ teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you. And behold, I am with you always, to the end of the age."

Matthew 28:16-20 (ESV)

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

In any job, a job description is absolutely essential to successfully doing your job. If you don't have a job description, you don't know what to do. So, you can't really do it well. If you have a job description but do something else every day at work, you might be a really nice employee and a really good coworker, but you're not doing the job.

When I co-taught a course for graduating seniors at Augsburg University, my friend and co-instructor in the business department gave the students (and her co-instructor) this sage piece of advice: "Never take a job that doesn't have a clear job description. If you take the job, and you have trouble later on, go back to the job description, and if you need to, take your supervisor back to the job description too."

In any job, a clear job description is essential.

In Matthew 28, our risen Lord Jesus Christ gives us the job description of His Church. Before His ascension, Jesus tells His apostles—who will become the charter members of the Christian Church on earth—what they are supposed to do. We call this job description of the Church, the Great Commission.

Jesus says:

Make Disciples

Baptize

Teach

Hold to everything I have commanded to you

This is our job description—yours and mine as disciples of Jesus. This is the job description of the Christian Church on earth. And this, brothers and sisters, is the job description of our congregation, Jehovah Lutheran Church.

As we move from the Easter season, through Pentecost, and into the "Time of the Church," I think we would do well as a congregation to remember the mission, the job description, our risen Lord Jesus has given us. I think this is especially true as we near the 100-year anniversary of the founding of our congregation.

Our job as a congregation is not just to keep the lights on and the building open (though it's a beautiful building). Our job is not just to be a presence in the city of St. Paul (though we want to be good neighbors). Our job isn't just to be a social event center (though our fellowship together warms our hearts). Our job is not just to meet our budget (though we are grateful that God moves our hearts to keep our financial promises and to give generously). Our job is to proclaim to the Gospel of the risen Lord Jesus Christ. Our job (given to us by Christ Himself) is to make disciples, to baptize, to teach, and to hold fast to everything that Christ has given to us.

For the next few months in our newsletter, my pastoral letter to you will look at one of the aspects of the job description that Jesus gives us in Matthew 28. I pray that the Holy Spirit would move all of our hearts to go back to our job description and live out our calling of mission and to walk together on the road of discipleship on which our Lord has sent us. I pray that we will make our divinely given job description central to every Divine Service, every education class, every visit, every outreach event, every board meeting, and every conversation we have with one another.

ST. PAUL OUTREACH CENTER TO LAUNCH THIS FALL

On May 23, an initial coordination meeting took place at the LCMS Minnesota South District Office in Burnville with these people: Pastor Vue Lee (MNS District/formerly at King of Kings), Pastor Joshua Miller (Jehovah), Pastor Francis Stephanos (Mekane Yesus – Emeritus Pastor), Dr. David Mennicke (outreach coordinator), and Nader Alaraj (POBLO Missionary). The group began laying out plans for a "St. Paul Outreach Center" that will launch after school programs for new immigrants in the fall. Possible topics for the classes (intended for children and for elders) include IT/computer education, Basketball/Phy Ed., Math, English, Music, Amharic, biology/ chemistry, cultural training/orientation, and Bible Study. Mekane Jesus is planning pilot offerings this summer, along with an August 12 open house highlighting the fall offerings. Our goal is to coordinate these with POBLO's small group offerings. The sharing of the Gospel of Christ will be key to these programs.

We ask all members of JELC to pray for this ministry as it is being planned this summer. JELC members also will have volunteer opportunities to support the Outreach Center in the fall. Please watch for more information later in the summer.



"We preach Christ crucified" (1 COR. 1:23).

We chose this simple statement as the theme for our upcoming LCMS convention in Milwaukee. As I have prepared for the convention, these words have resonated in my mind. These words describe our church. We, the LCMS, preach Christ crucified along with the apostles and the whole Christian church throughout the world.

Not only do we enjoy fellowship with every Christian of every time and place, but we also seek to reach all people with the Gospel, for not all have heard. One thing that diminishes our ability to share the Good News with all people is language. Since the tower of Babel in Genesis 11, people have spoken different languages. Yet as we learned in Acts 2, the message of the Gospel unites people into the one Body of Christ.

Therefore, we have designated our 2023–2026 LCMS National Offering, "We Preach Christ Crucified for All People," for the translation of solid biblical Lutheran resources into languages that lack such materials. Whatever you generously contribute to this offering will enable this vital work. We thank God for all those who have labored to translate the Scriptures. You will help provide instructional and doctrinal resources LCMS congregations can use to reach and instruct non-English speakers in His Word.

Our 2019 convention theme verses included Paul's words, "Pray without ceasing" (1 THESS. 5:17). I have made it my habit to pray before I start my day, praying for individuals, members of my congregation, international church leaders, people I have met and, of course, the Synod at large. Many times, the Psalms of David
