#### Walking Together as Disciples for Life:

Disciples - Baptizing and Baptized

16 Now the eleven disciples went to Galilee, to the mountain to which Jesus had directed them. <sup>17</sup> And when they saw him they worshiped him, but some doubted. <sup>18</sup> And Jesus came and said to them, "All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. <sup>19</sup> Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, <sup>20</sup> teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you. And behold, I am with you always, to the end of the age."

Matthew 28:16-20 (ESV)

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

We continue looking at the job description that Jesus has given to us as His disciples. Jesus has told us as His disciples that our calling is to participate in making more disciples, and He tells us how to do this:

- Baptizing
- Teaching
- Holding fast to what He has commended to us

This month, we meditate on the first of these three aspects of discipleship: baptizing.

As disciples of Jesus, we make more disciples by baptizing new Christians, but we ourselves are also defined as disciples by our own baptism. As disciples we are baptizing and baptized.

As disciples of Jesus we baptize. We baptize children and adults. Jesus has commanded us to baptize all nations. This includes adults who come to faith later in life, infants born into Christian families, and the children of families who come into the Christian faith from the outside. This has been the faithful practice of Christians from the very earliest days of the church in the New Testament. Baptism is the means through which disciples of Jesus are made and come into His body, the Christian Church. We are called to baptize.

This, of course, means that we have to introduce some people to Jesus through sharing the Gospel with them before they are baptized. For this to happen, we need a context and a relationship with unbaptized people. This is the deep motivation for all of our outreach work in the Christian Church.

Right now, we are beginning to work together with other congregations on our St. Paul Circuit of LCMS congregations and with our Minnesota-South District in a new outreach venture called the St. Paul Outreach Center (SPOC). This cooperative center has three developing avenues of outreach:

- 1) English Conversation Classes
- 2) After-school Programs and Fitness
- 3) Family Resource Center

All three of these have the same goal: the cultivation of wholistic relationships where we serve the needs of our neighbors and, at the same time, foster relationships where we can share the Gospel and—when and where the Holy Spirit wills—bring those who do not yet know Jesus into a relationship with Him through Holy Baptism.

Baptism: that is the means of making disciples and the goal of outreach. If you want to know more about any of these three avenues of outreach and how you can help, please contact me or the Outreach Coordinator of the SPOC: Dr. David Mennicke. We are excited to see how the Spirit works through these outreach efforts to bring people to Jesus Christ.

But baptism is not just for new disciples.

Baptism is also for continuing disciples. That means baptism is for you and for me as we live out our Christian lives every day. In fact, baptism remains the means of discipleship through our entire lives.

In his book, Luther's Small Catechism: A Manual for Discipleship, John Pless says it like this:

"Baptism is not a ceremony that we now see only in the rearview mirror. It is not just, 'I was baptized, but I am baptized.' Baptism is present tense."

We live in and live out our baptism every single day of our Christian lives, because being a disciple means being baptized. Being a disciple means "I am baptized." The ongoing part of discipleship, growing in the Christian faith, means living in who we are in baptism and living it out through serving others and sharing Christ with them.

St. Paul explains what this means in Romans 6, when he says:

"Do you not know that all of us who have been baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into his death? We were buried therefore with him by baptism into death, in order that, just as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, we too might walk in newness of life."

Being the disciples of Jesus means living in our baptism each day by dying to sin and living out our baptism each day by rising again through Christ to live for Him. This newness of life that comes to us through baptism is the life of following Jesus: following Him through death into resurrection. And it will continue every day of our life, until we come to the end of our life and these words of Paul in Romans 6 are said over us as the pall is placed over our bodies and we follow our Lord Jesus into the fullness of eternal life.

In the meantime, we continue to live out our baptismal identity as Jesus' disciples. I invite you to live deeply into this identity. Join us together in reaching out to our neighbors. Join us in Living by Faith (Sundays at 11:00am), Rooted in Faith (Wednesdays at 6:30pm), and men's Bible study or ladies' Bible study. Join us in the Divine Service (Sundays at 9:30am). Join us in supporting God's work among us with your time, talents, and treasures. Join us in walking together as baptizing and baptized disciples of our Lord Jesus Christ.

# ST. PAUL OUTREACH CENTER TO LAUNCH THIS FALL

On May 23, an initial coordination meeting took place at the LCMS Minnesota South District Office in Burnville with these people: Pastor Vue Lee (MNS District/formerly at King of Kings), Pastor Joshua Miller (Jehovah), Pastor Francis Stephanos (Mekane Yesus - Emeritus Pastor), Dr. David Mennicke (SPOC outreach coordinator), and Nader Alaraj (POBLO Missionary). The group began laying out plans for a "St. Paul Outreach Center" (SPOC) that will launch after-school programs for new immigrants in the fall. Possible topics for the classes (intended for children and for elders) include IT/computer education, Basketball/Phy Ed., Math, English, Music, Amharic, biology/chemistry, cultural training/orientation, and Bible Study. Mekane Yesus is planning pilot offerings this summer, along with an August 12 open house highlighting the fall offerings. Our goal is to coordinate these with POBLO's small group offerings. The sharing of the Gospel of Christ will be key to these programs.

We ask all members of JELC to pray for this ministry as it is being planned this summer. JELC members also will have volunteer opportunities to support the Outreach Center in the fall. Please watch for more information later in the summer.

One thing that diminishes our ability to share the Good News with all people is language. Since the tower of Babel in Genesis 11, people have spoken different languages. Yet as we learned in Acts 2, the message of the Gospel unites people into the one Body of Christ.

Therefore, we have designated our 2023–2026 LCMS National Offering, "We Preach Christ Crucified for All People," for the translation of solid biblical Lutheran resources into languages that lack such materials. Whatever you generously contribute to this offering will enable this vital work. We thank God for all those who have labored to translate the Scriptures. You will help provide instructional and doctrinal resources LCMS congregations can use to reach and instruct non-English speakers in His Word.

Our 2019 convention theme verses included Paul's words, "Pray without ceasing" (1 THESS. 5:17). I have made it my habit to pray before I start my day, praying for individuals, members of my congregation, international church leaders, people I have met and, of course, the Synod at large. Many times, the Psalms of David provide the words for my prayers.

I invite you to take this insert home to assist you in your personal or family prayers. Pray for those who translate Lutheran resources, that their labor would produce faithful and beneficial materials for those who use them. Pray for those who receive their work. Pray for our international church partners. Pray for all those who do not know Jesus. Join me in daily prayers, for our Lord has graciously invited us to bring before Him all our concerns, all through Jesus Christ crucified and risen. We preach Christ crucified — for all people.
