The Joy of Advent

Rejoice greatly, O daughter of Zion!
Shout aloud, O daughter of Jerusalem!
Behold, your king is coming to you;
righteous and having salvation is he,
humble and mounted on a donkey,
on a colt, the foal of a donkey.
Zechariah 9:9 and Matthew 21:5 (ESV).

Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Rejoice! Your King is coming to you!

Advent is probably my favorite time in the
Church year. It's a time of expectant joy! It's a
time when we begin to anticipate the joy that
Christmas brings. As we put up decorations, buy
gifts for others, and fill out Christmas cards, this
joy becomes palpable as we begin to catch the
excitement and expectation of looking forward
to Christmas.

Sometimes we might think of Advent as a time of darkness, since the days are getting shorter and there is less and less sunlight (at least up North here in Minnesota). Sometimes this darkness darkens our moods too. As it gets colder, we may go outside less and tend to keep to ourselves more. In this context, we might begin to see Advent as a time of dark and introspection. But this should not be!

Advent is a season of light! It is the season of the Light of Christ shinning into the darkness and brokenness of this world. It is a season of hope. Advent is truly a season of joy.

In his book entitled, Surprised by Joy, C. S. Lewis notes that the nature of joy is somewhat paradoxical. One the one hand, we have joy when we receive and possess something we want. But, on the other hand, we also have joy when we want that thing and are still waiting to get it.¹

Behold, your king is coming to you.



This is certainly true about the joy of Advent. On the one hand, we already have received what—or rather Who—brings us joy at Advent. We have already received our Lord Jesus Christ who has come to each of us. On the other hand, we also joyfully anticipate Jesus' coming to us once again. For, as Bishop Bo Giertz puts it, Christ Jesus is by definition the one who comes to us. He is the one who comes to us again and again.²

Christ has come. Christ does come. Christ will come. Christ Jesus has come as the baby in the manger. Christ Jesus comes to us in His Word and Sacraments. Christ Jesus will come to usher in the new heaven and new earth. Christ is the one who comes, and His coming fills us with joy—joy that we have Him and joy that we continually anticipate Him.

At Advent, even though we do have Christ now, we focus especially on the joy of anticipating His coming. This joy is like the expectation of a young child who sees her presents under the Christmas tree in early December. She is excited for what she is going to receive. That excitement fills her with joy that anticipates opening the gift on Christmas.

At Jehovah Lutheran this year, let's think of Advent with this kind of expectant joy. As we move closer to Christmas, we have the opportunity to join together in worship on Sundays and Wednesday nights to celebrate this joy! On Sunday mornings, in our sermons, we will hear about Advent Acclamations that describe the joy of anticipating the coming Christ. On Wednesday nights, we'll focus on Christ already present among us, as we unwrap His gifts of Word and Sacrament.

This year, on Wednesdays, we get the awesome opportunity to share our Advent joy with our brothers and sisters from Concordia University, St. Paul and Mekane Yesus Fellowship. We also will have our afterschool outreach on Wednesdays at 4:30pm, followed by a free community soup supper at 5:30pm. Special thanks go to my brothers from the CSP Theology and Ministry faculty, Rev. Dr. Joshua Hollmann and Rev. Dr. Samuel Deressa, who will be joining me in bringing our midweek sermons this year!

If you would like to come to midweek services but are hesitant to drive in the dark, please let us know in the church office, and we will do our best to help provide rides!

PREPARING FOR WORSHIP

December 3

Isaiah 64:1-9

The prophet prays on behalf of Israel that God would reveal his power as of old, turn his anger from their sin and have compassion, for they cry "You are our Father."

1 Corinthians 1:3-9

Paul urges the excitable Corinthians to stand firm in Christ Jesus and to depend on God's faithful help to remain blameless on the day of Christ's coming.

Mark 11:1-10

Jesus' Triumphal entry into Jerusalem.



December 10

Isaiah 40:1-11

The prophet's voice cries out in the wilderness, "Prepare the way of the Lord" who comes to bring comfort and salvation to his people.

2 Peter 3:8-14

The day of the Lord will come surely though unexpectedly. "While you are waiting" consider what sort of persons you ought to be.

Mark 1:1-8

The Baptist's voice cries out in the wilderness, "Prepare the way of the Lord" by repenting of your sins and receiving forgiveness.

December 17

Isaiah 61:1-4,8-11

The prophet announces glad tidings to oppressed Israel in words later used by Jesus to announce his ministry to all peoples, fulfilling God's ancient promise.

1 Thessalonians 5:16-24

Paul exhorts the Thessalonians to maintain a life of joy, prayer and thanksgiving, and of holding to the good so as to be blameless at the coming of the Lord Christ.

John 1:6-8, 19-28

The Gospel of John describes Jesus as "the light of the world". The role of John the Baptist is to testify to the coming of that light.

December 24

2 Samuel 7:1-11, 16

David wishes to build a temple for the Lord but God declares that he himself will establish a house and kingdom that will endure forever.

Romans 16:25-27

Paul praises God for the proclamation of the gospel of Jesus Christ now revealed so that all nations might believe and obey him.

Luke 1:26-38

Mary's son will be God's son who will reign over an everlasting kingdom. Mary is the model of faith in accepting God's grace at work in her.

December 31

Isaiah 61:10-62:3

The prophet identifies himself with Zion and rejoices in her salvation. She will become a shining light to the nations.

Galatians 4:4-7

"In the fullness of time" God sent his Son to redeem those under the law that we might become his full heirs, certified by the Spirit.

Luke 2:22-40

Joseph and Mary bring Jesus to Jerusalem to present him to the Lord, according to the law. The infant is recognized by Simeon and Anna as the one to bring salvation to all people.

THE NEW FREEDOM STORE FREEDOM IN CHRIST

"You gotta walk the Jesus walk before you talk the Jesus talk"

— A saying from an anonymous prisoner

Our Bible tells us that Jesus traveled from town to town during his time. He reached out to the poorer quarters and lived with them, too. Nicodemus went to see him under the cover of night. Once, when asked, Jesus told a rich man, "Give everything you have to the poor and follow me."

He once told us, "A new command I give you: Love one another. As I have loved you, so you must love one another. By this everyone will know that you are my disciples." Perhaps today's version of the Jesus walk is just that simple, a direct guid pro guo of giving to each other, especially those in need.

Impossible? Maybe not! One of our sponsors, Bombas socks, does exactly that. They donate one pair of socks for every pair they sell. Bombas gave us 1,000 pairs this year. They are a for-profit organization too! These are good socks. Next time you need some, buy Bombas! Make them Christmas presents. Explain that Jesus walk to your children.

Or if you stay at a hotel, take that extra bar of soap with you. Next time you go to the store to buy a washcloth or a hand towel, donate your old one. Better yet, just buy two. This is the new Christian walk. It need not be physical. It is mental, a simple form of mindfulness. Maybe too, you can get together with some friends or form a group at your church. Start a drop box.

And, when you have collected enough to make the trip worth the while, just drop them off at Jehovah Lutheran or even my house. The New Freedom Store will pack them up and make sure your gifts will go where they are needed. The store packed 60 this week and gave away a truck load of your lovely quilts. Bless you!
