One Lord, one faith, one baptism *Ephesians 4:5*

They Rejoiced Exceedingly with Great Joy

When they saw the star, they rejoiced exceedingly with great joy. And going into the house, they saw the child with Mary his mother, and they fell down and worshiped him.

Matthew 2:10-11a (ESV).

Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Rejoice! Christ has come for you!

In the Gospel reading for the Epiphany of our Lord, we read that when the star led the wisemen to the Christ Child, "They rejoiced exceedingly with great joy!" In other words, the wisemen rejoiced three times over. They rejoicingly rejoiced with great joy! That's a lot of joy!

And it should be. For the baby the wisemen beheld in the manger is none other than God come in the flesh to embark upon His work of renewing all creation. Just how much the wisemen understood about the identity and mission of the child they came to worship, we're not really sure. Matthew doesn't tell us that.

But what Matthew does tell us is that the wisemen were absolutely overjoyed to find Jesus. And this joy of the wisemen contrasts significantly with the bad attitude King Herod has about the birth of baby Jesus. For Herod is stuck in a fearful world of his own making. It is often said that power corrupts, and that absolute power corrupts absolutely. Well, if this were true of anyone, it certainly was true about King Herod.

Herod was absolutely roaring drunk on absolute power. With the help of the Romans, Herod achieved almost godlike status in his own day. He destroyed all enemies and took the throne in a three-way war for control over the land of Judea and Galilee. He survived a Roman Empire-wide civil war by changing sides with the changing of the tide of war. Herod built an army, a navy, docks, roads, aqueducts, bridges, fortresses, and he even left his own stamp on the Temple in Jerusalem through a serious redecorating program.

But it wasn't enough. Herod was afraid that some rival outside or inside of his household would try to take the throne from him. Moved by this fear, Herod promulgated a purge of his government and his family. Out of the fear of losing his throne and his power, Herod even killed his own wife and children. So bloody were the purges within Herod's own family that the Roman Emperor Augustus once remarked that he would rather be Herod's pig than Herod's son.

Herod's maniacal fear of losing power forms the background of our Epiphany Gospel. Herod's love of power and his fear of losing power motivates his hatred of the newborn Jesus. It leads to his plot to murder the Christ Child and to take down many other babies and toddlers with him.

This, brothers and sisters, is the real meaning of sin.

Sin is wanting to be our own god and wanting this power so much that we should shut everyone else out, live in fear and hatred, and even turn that hate against God himself. And left to ourselves, that's where we'd be—turned in upon ourselves against God for all eternity.

But, God sent forth His fully divine Son to save us from ourselves. Christ, God the Son, is born in Bethlehem to set us free! Christ sets us free from hatred and fear. Christ sets us free from the demented desire to be our own God. Christ sets us free for joy.

The freedom that this child born of Mary brings to us swallows up all hatred. It pushes out all fear. It puts to death the desire to be our own God. It takes us off of the throne of our hearts and puts the newborn Jesus there.

Being encountered by Jesus Christ gives us joy, and it is joy that is exceedingly joyfully great joy!

PASTORAL AND CONGREGATIONAL GOALS FOR 2024

January 7

Genesis 1:1-5

God overcame the chaos of the watery abyss and primordial night, creating an inhabitable world with light and the separation of waters.

Mark 1:4-11

January 14

1 Samuel 3:1-10

The Lord calls the boy Samuel. He responds obediently and all Israel comes to recognize him as a prophet of the Lord.

1 Corinthians 6:12-20

God gives us our body as a gift, a sanctuary of the Holy Spirit and belonging to Christ. "Therefore glorify God in your body."

John 1:43-51

Nathanael responds to the invitation to "Come and see," testifies to Jesus as King of Israel, and is promised a vision of the Son of Man.

January 21

Jonah 3:1-5, 10

In this quaint and humorous story Jonah responds reluctantly to preach to Nineveh. He learns that God decides on whom He will have mercy.

1 Corinthians 7:29-35

Paul expects the imminent return of the Lord and recommends avoiding new commitments so as to stay free from cares.

Mark 1:14-20

Jesus begins his ministry by proclaiming the good news that God's kingdom is at hand. The call to "repent and believe" means a reorientation of life.

Deuteronomy 18:15-20

Moses assures the Israelites that, when he passes on, the Lord will raise up successor prophets from among them to speak his words.

1 Corinthians 8:1-13

Some had conscientious scruples about eating food offered to idols, others did not. Paul's principle: How our actions impact others should guide our decisions.

Mark 1:21--28

"The kingdom is near," Jesus had proclaimed. That now becomes evident as he teaches and acts with authority.
