Hope in Christ!

Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ! According to his great mercy, he has caused us to be born again to a living hope through the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead... 1 Peter 1:3 (ESV).

Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Easter is right around the corner! Soon we will celebrate our Lord's resurrection and the hope that brings into our world and into our lives. In his first letter, St. Peter tells us why we have Easter hope: we have been reborn into the resurrection of Christ. This hope, given to us in our baptism, is not just for the Easter season but, instead, carries us through our whole lives long. You and I can have confidence in our Christian lives, we can face the future, because through Holy Baptism, we have been reborn through the very same power that raised Jesus from the dead.

And this resurrection power is the fuel on which the Church runs too! This truth—that Christ Jesus is the hope of the Church—is the theme for the entire March issue of the Lutheran Witness (the magazine of the LCMS). I heartily encourage you to read through this issue. In his article entitled, "Quiet Despair and Its Remedies," my friend and brother-in-the-office, Pastor Adam Koontz reminds us that we have no cause to despair in the Church, because Christ Jesus is our head and our hope. Since the future of Jesus is sure and certain, the future of His Church can only be helpful. As we as a congregation live out our faith in a despairing and hopeless world, we do so knowing that our hope and future as God's people are sure and certain because they are formed, commanded, and guided by Christ Jesus!



2023–2025 Mission Grant No. 7 MENTAL HEALTH TRAINING AND OUTREACH LCMS Life Ministry | \$96,500

There is a need and opportunity for Lutheran outreach to people struggling with mental illnesses and disorders. However, it is challenging for pastors, church workers and lay leaders because they do not have enough training to provide effective and appropriate care. LCMS Life Ministry received an LWML Mission Grant of \$96,500 to help meet the cost of developing materials for training church workers as they minister to those suffering from mental illnesses.

2023–2025 Mission Grant No. 9 EQUIPPING YOUNG LEADERS LCMS Youth Ministry | \$50,000

LWML Mission Grant #9, Equipping Young Leaders will allow LCMS Youth Ministries to develop new curriculums for four regional YouthLead events, pilot a new Servant Event for youth, and develop a survey for Generation Z. These projects are to help teens and young adults stay connected to the church and grow in their faith in Jesus Christ.

2023–2025 Mission Grant No. 10 SET APART TO SERVE LCMS Office of Pastoral Education | \$100,000

Set Apart to Serve is an LCMS initiative with the purpose of forming and recruiting full-time church workers. Christ's church continues to need church workers for the building up of the kingdom. Along with your mite offerings to support this LWML mission grant, you can support Set Apart to Serve by praying for God to provide church workers, talking to your children about becoming church workers, and thanking God for the people who work in your congregation.
